A BILL

To require a background check for every firearm sale.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Background Check Ex-
- 5 pansion Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FIREARMS TRANSFERS.
- 7 (a) In General.—Section 922 of title 18, United
- 8 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 9 lowing:
- ((aa)(1)(A)) It shall be unlawful for any person who
- 11 is not a licensed importer, licensed manufacturer, or li-
- 12 censed dealer to transfer a firearm to any other person

- 1 who is not so licensed, unless a licensed importer, licensed
- 2 manufacturer, or licensed dealer has first taken possession
- 3 of the firearm for the purpose of complying with sub-
- 4 section (t).
- 5 "(B) Upon taking possession of a firearm under sub-
- 6 paragraph (A), a licensee shall comply with all require-
- 7 ments of this chapter as if the licensee were transferring
- 8 the firearm from the inventory of the licensee to the unli-
- 9 censed transferee.
- 10 "(C) If a transfer of a firearm described in subpara-
- 11 graph (A) will not be completed for any reason after a
- 12 licensee takes possession of the firearm (including because
- 13 the transfer of the firearm to, or receipt of the firearm
- 14 by, the transferee would violate this chapter), the return
- 15 of the firearm to the transferor by the licensee shall not
- 16 constitute the transfer of a firearm for purposes of this
- 17 chapter.
- 18 "(2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply to—
- "(A) a law enforcement agency or any law en-
- 20 forcement officer, armed private security profes-
- sional, or member of the armed forces, to the extent
- the officer, professional, or member is acting within
- 23 the course and scope of employment and official du-
- 24 ties;

1	"(B) a transfer that is a loan or bona fide gift
2	between spouses, between domestic partners, be-
3	tween parents and their children, including step-par-
4	ents and their step-children, between siblings, be-
5	tween aunts or uncles and their nieces or nephews,
6	or between grandparents and their grandchildren;
7	"(C) a transfer to an executor, administrator,
8	trustee, or personal representative of an estate or a
9	trust that occurs by operation of law upon the death
10	of another person;
11	"(D) a temporary transfer that is necessary to
12	prevent imminent death or great bodily harm, in-
13	cluding harm to self, family, household members, or
14	others, if the possession by the transferee lasts only
15	as long as immediately necessary to prevent the im-
16	minent death or great bodily harm, including the
17	harm of domestic violence, dating partner violence,
18	sexual assault, stalking, and domestic abuse;
19	"(E) a transfer that is approved by the Attor-
20	ney General under section 5812 of the Internal Rev-
21	enue Code of 1986; or
22	"(F) a temporary transfer if the transferor has
23	no reason to believe that the transferee will use or
24	intends to use the firearm in a crime or is prohibited
25	from possessing firearms under State or Federal

1	law, and the transfer takes place and the trans-
2	feree's possession of the firearm is exclusively—
3	"(i) at a shooting range or in a shooting
4	gallery or other area designated for the purpose
5	of target shooting;
6	"(ii) while reasonably necessary for the
7	purposes of hunting, trapping, or fishing, if the
8	transferor—
9	"(I) has no reason to believe that the
10	transferee intends to use the firearm in a
11	place where it is illegal; and
12	"(II) has reason to believe that the
13	transferee will comply with all licensing
14	and permit requirements for such hunting,
15	trapping, or fishing; or
16	"(iii) while in the presence of the trans-
17	feror.
18	"(3) It shall be unlawful for a licensed importer, li-
19	censed manufacturer, or licensed dealer to transfer posses-
20	sion of, or title to, a firearm to another person who is
21	not so licensed unless the importer, manufacturer, or deal-
22	er has provided such other person with a notice of the
23	prohibition under paragraph (1), and such other person
24	has certified that such other person has been provided

1 with this notice on a form prescribed by the Attorney Gen-

- 2 eral.".
- 3 (b) AMENDMENT TO SECTION 924(a).—Section
- 4 924(a)(5) of title 18, United States Code, is amended by
- 5 striking "(s) or (t)" and inserting "(s), (t), or (aa)".
- 6 (c) Rules of Interpretation.—Nothing in this
- 7 Act, or any amendment made by this Act, shall be con-
- 8 strued to—
- 9 (1) authorize the establishment, directly or indi-
- 10 rectly, of a national firearms registry; or
- 11 (2) interfere with the authority of a State,
- under section 927 of title 18, United States Code,
- to enact a law on the same subject matter as this
- 14 Act.
- 15 (d) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 16 subsections (a) and (b) shall take effect 180 days after
- 17 the date of enactment of this Act.
