## U.S. General Services Administration

A Report on feasibility of establishing a repository for information on waivers to the Buy American Act

## Legislative Background

The Explanatory Statement of Division E, Financial Services and General Government<sup>1</sup>, in the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2018 (P.L. 115-141), included language stating that "The creation of a government-wide website, called Buy American.gov, would provide a comprehensive government-wide repository for information about waivers to the Buy American Act, Berry Amendment and other domestic content statutes; assist small- and medium-sized manufacturers; and achieve some of the goals of President Trump's Executive Order on Buy American. GSA is encouraged, in conjunction with OMB, to examine the feasibility of establishing such a website, and to report to the House and Senate Committees on Appropriations within 120 days after enactment of this Act." Congressional Record Volume 164, Number 150, March 22, 2018.

## **Results of GSA Review**

The General Services Administration (GSA) has examined the feasibility of providing a unified site for the public to review Buy American Act (BAA) waivers and exceptions and provides the following information on how the legislative report language would be implemented. GSA is able to provide information regarding the Government-wide use of Buy American waivers by adding capability to an existing government-wide point of entry, namely FedBizOpps (fbo.gov). This existing Government-wide platform is currently used by companies interested in doing business with the Federal government, so providing the BAA data here eliminates costs for standing up a new location and is a convenient and public way for prospective offerors seeking opportunities to view the data, as well as the general public.

GSA will register BuyAmerican.gov, which will serve as the public access point for the Buy American Act waiver and exception information submitted by Federal agencies. The site will open to the waiver data displayed on FebBizOpps.gov and its successor site (<a href="www.sam.gov">www.sam.gov</a>). When users access BuyAmerican.gov, they will be automatically be re-directed to the appropriate entity that hosts the waiver data.

## Status of Implementation

GSA has already begun implementing some of the elements in the appropriations report language. In July 2018, in order to provide visibility into the use of Buy American Act (BAA) waivers and exceptions, and to promote purchase of goods produced in the United States, GSA — in coordination with the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) — added a new feature to the FedBizOpps website (FBO.gov) providing access to historical agency spend data regarding waivers and exceptions to the BAA. That data, which is required to be reported by contracting officials Government-wide in the Federal Procurement Data System (FPDS), will be updated on

a monthly basis so that users can view agency spending information under exceptions and waivers to the BAA.

This Government-wide repository of data will be maintained by GSA's Integrated Award Environment (IAE) Office and modernized into SAM.gov. In doing so, the IAE, in collaboration with the Federal Acquisition Institute, would be able to use the Learning Center to provide educational content on implementing the BAA alongside this BAA waiver and exception information, as appropriate.


Displaying waivers and exceptions to the Berry Amendment and other domestic content statutes is not possible at this time, as there is no current requirement for such data to be centrally reported. As such, there



is there is no mechanism by which GSA can include this data along with the use of BAA waivers and exceptions.

The data fields contained in the hosted report can be found below. The earliest entry in the file has a start date of June 30, 2016, and will show the following information for acquisitions with a Buy American Act waiver:

- Funding Agency Name,

- Place of Manufacture Description (this field displays the type of Buy American Act waiver or exception employed)
- Country of Product or Service Origin Code
- PIID
