11 AMENDMENT INTENDED TO BE PROPOSED BY MR. MURPHY AND  
12 MR. PORTMAN

14 On page 28, after line 3, add the following:

15 **SEC. 16. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

16 (a) In General.—There is authorized to be appropriated to the Department of State  
17 \$50,000,000 for each of the fiscal years 2022 through 2026 for the purposes described in  
18 subsection (b) with respect to Ukraine.

19 (b) Use of Funds.—Amounts appropriated pursuant to subsection (a) may only be used—

20 (1) to strengthen Ukraine’s cyber security, cyber resilience and intellectual property  
21 enforcement, including expanding the United States Transnational and High Tech Crime  
22 Global Law Enforcement Network through International Computer Hacking and Intellectual  
23 Property Advisor or Intellectual Property Law Enforcement Coordinators to provide  
24 training and capacity building related to cyber crime and intellectual property crime;

25 (2) to provide support and training in Ukraine for—

26 (A) sectoral reforms related to banking and public finance management reform;

27 (B) the privatization of state-owned enterprises;

28 (C) regulatory independence;

29 (D) subsidy reform;

30 (E) land reform;

31 (F) corporate governance; and

32 (G) foreign investment screening;

33 (3) to combat corruption, improve the rule of law, and otherwise strengthen independent  
34 legal institutions, including by—

1 (A) expanding regional anti-corruption training and exchanges among Ukrainian  
2 Ministry officials, law enforcement officers, judges, and prosecutors to build peer  
3 support, share best practices, maintain reform momentum and protect reforms from  
4 capture;

5 (B) supporting regional training of United States Embassy personnel responsible for  
6 supporting anti-corruption and the rule of law to improve their effectiveness in  
7 supporting the consolidation and expansion of reform;

8 (4) to respond to the humanitarian crises caused or aggravated by the invasion and  
9 occupation of Ukraine by the Russian Federation, including by supporting internally  
10 displaced persons and communities in conflict-affected areas;

11 (5) to improve participatory legislative processes in Ukraine, including through—

12 (A) engagement with members of the Verkhovna Rada; and

13 (B) training on government oversight, legal education, political transparency and  
14 competition, and compliance with international obligations; and

15 (C) supporting the development of professional legislative staff to advise and assist  
16 members of the Verkhovna Rada and committees in the execution of their duties and  
17 build legal and policy expertise within the Verkhovna Rada

18 (6) to further build the capacity of civil society, independent media, human rights and  
19 other nongovernmental organizations in Ukraine, with an emphasis on—

20 (A) building capacity outside of Kyiv; and

21 (B) regional civil society training and exchange programs.  
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
